Advocacy Update

In September, the APLA Executive wrote a letter to the Nova Scotia Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism & Heritage MLA, Dave Ritcey, to bring attention to the urgent need for renewed provincial support for Nova Scotia public libraries. We specifically requested that the Government of Nova Scotia:

- Renew and modernize the provincial funding framework to provide stable, multi-year support. 1.
- 2. Ensure equitable baseline funding for both urban and rural communities.
- 3. Support infrastructure and technology upgrades to promote digital equity.


I am pleased to share that the Hon. Dave Ritcey responded with encouraging comments regarding the importance of public libraries and the province's commitment to continued collaboration. In his letter, he wrote:

"Like you and the members of the Atlantic Provinces Library Association (APLA), I believe that public libraries are important community assets. They have demonstrated their strategic position and willingness to assist government in getting resources and information to Nova Scotians. Their contributions to their communities are significant.

Also, I am aware of the challenges that the public libraries face as they serve their communities. We will continue to work collaboratively with the sector to address the issues and find solutions for sustainable funding for Nova Scotia's public libraries."
