

### **Accessibility Efforts Continue**

A call for community members to join our Library Accessibility Committee was officially published on July 18th. We extended the deadline, and received a total of five applications. Our Accessibility lead hosted the newly formed Committee for a "Meet and Greet" in November. The Committee will officially start meeting in January to work on implementing the Library's Accessibility Plan. The Committee will consist of one Board member, one staff member, and five community members.

Library staff also conducted an audit of the Springhill Miners Memorial Library with the Municipality of Cumberland County's Community Engagement Coordinator on November 26. This directly relates to the Library Accessibility Plan's commitment to audit library locations, and the Board's desire for us to conduct facility audits with our Municipal partners.
