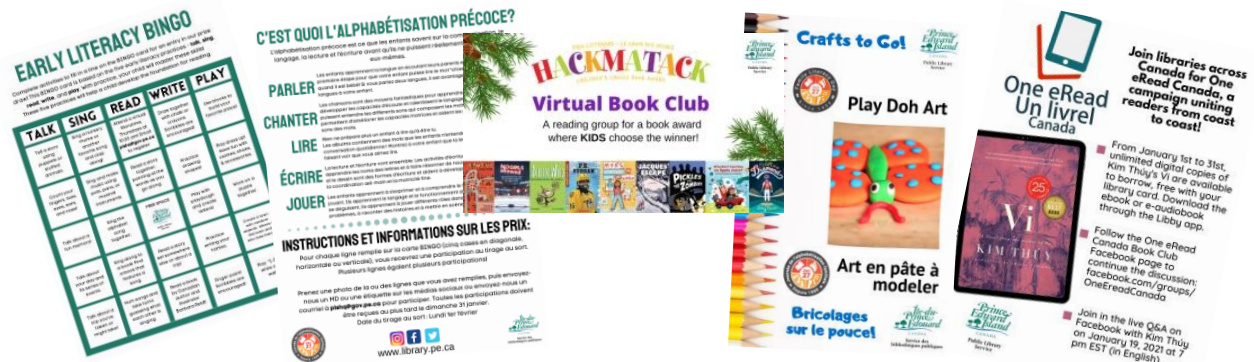


Virtual Programs
